What are we up to right now?

- Following a successful funding application, we have received monies to be put towards planting and other improvements in the village from Highcross Leicester.
- We are encouraged to hear positive comments from people who complement us on our work litter picking and planting. We are, however, disappointed that some of our flower beds seem to have become the target of theft of shrubs and damage to plants. It takes a lot of hard work to raise money for new planting in the village, and equally hard work to plant and maintain these areas, and it is sad that some feel the need to destroy these. It then costs our group further time to generate funding and more time to then put it all back into shape.
- We have submitted an application for further funding for various litter picking equipment required by the group. We were pleased with the turn out to our litter pick with the Newfoundland dogs on 27th March. 28 bags of rubbish, a carpet and a tyre were cleared by the 23 volunteers who came along. Thank you to all who helped and took time out to clear up other people's litter and to Llynda and Darryl and their dogs Alice and Robbie for their invaluable help.
- We have two walks in May which form part of the National Forest Walks Festival. These are 23rd May, 2pm from The Green – Cademan and Swannymote and 30th May, 2pm from The Green – Grace Dieu Woods, canal, railway and priory. On 13th June, at 2pm from The Green we have our Blue Plaque Walk and at 10.30am from The Green on 27th June, we have a Thringstone to Coleorton via Swannington Walk. Come and learn more about where you live. Walks cost £2 per person. All welcome.

Did you know?

On The Green used to stand an old barn and a saw pit, the latter owned by George Gough, also licensee of The Rose and Crown and owner for many years of The Green before disposing of it to the brewery. In the saw pit, he made posts and rails for neighbouring farmers. His pub used to provide accommodation for outriders who would stay there for 2- 3 days whilst on business in the area with horses being stabled down Drury Lane. The Green was the social centre for the village. At the Barn End, the men would congregate to discuss topics of the day. The barn, erected to provide shelter for the outriders' vehicles, then became a shop before its eventual demolition.

What the Community Centre offers the village and surrounding area

There is also a downstairs bar at the centre stocking a good selection of wines, spirits, beers and soft drinks. This is open most weekday evenings.

The centre also offers various resources for a small fee, including kitchen facilities, tables, photocopier, fax, laminator, TV, video, cinema system, sewing machines, notice boards and information points.

The office is open Monday to Friday from 9am – 12 noon. Please contact the centre direct if you want to use any of these facilities.
